The climate challenge

 Mission: we bring together, inspire and empower a dynamic community to build a zero carbon economy and climate resilient society







Climate innovation

- 130 ideas submitted to our Pathfinder programme,
 - 42 selected for implementation
 - 2 new flagship programmes launched,
 - 8 new innovation projects,
 - $42_{\text{new pathfinder programmes}}$
- >85 knowledge transfer outcomes or adoptions
 - 21 new products or services launched

Reported capital attracted in 2015 was over €16,512,463



EIT Regional Innovation Scheme (EIT RIS)

- Climate-KIC started implementing the EIT RIS in 2014
- Currently we have regional partners in 9 countries
 - Bulgaria, Cyprus, Estonia, Latvia, Malta, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovenia
- Professional education, mobility and start-up acceleration
- Capacity-building and knowledge sharing
- Enabling synergies with the regions' smart specialisation goals
