The conference will be held on September 24-25, 2021.

3. Ethics, aesthetics, anthropology, the doctrine of existence.

Students, post-graduate students, teachers and scholars — historians, philologists, philosophers, religious studies scholars and cultural scientists, whose area of scientific interest is Classics, are invited to participate.

The conference will last for two days. The first day will be devoted to speeches at the sections, and the second day - lectures by leading experts in the field of antiquity.

We will gradually publish more specific information about lectures and speakers closer to the date of the event.

**Completion of registration and acceptance of abstracts** for participation in the conference is May 30, 2021.

Submissions will be published after the review process has been completed. It is planned to publish an electronic abstract of the conference materials.

Conference languages: Ukrainian and English.

Reports – oral, up to 10 minutes.

When constituting abstracts, it is recommended to avoid common phrases, to fully disclose the work essence and to outline its main results. The work must be carefully checked and edited. The abstract size should not exceed 2500 characters (with spaces). Placement of abstracts and tables in abstracts is not provided. When preparing abstracts, please carefully check the terms and quotations in Greek and Latin, and highlight them in italics. The quality of the published material is the responsibility of the author.

The organizing committee reserves the right to select materials for inclusion in the conference program and may reject the stated report without explanation.

# Please pay attention to the requirements for the preparation of articles!

#### **Requirements for editing the articles:**

— The Organizing Committee accepts materials in the form of electronic texts sent by e-mail to the editorial office (electronic document in MS Word-97-2000 format without positioning and hyphenation, font — Times New Roman, line spacing 1.5, size 14, except for character fonts in formulas).

— It is necessary to submit Ukrainian and English abstracts of the article, outlining the main methodological and methodical bases of the research, its results and conclusions (volume — about 1200 characters), as well as to indicate the

discipline to which the article belongs, and to give keywords in Ukrainian and English.

— The full name, contact telephone and e-mail of the author, as well as information about his/her place of work (with full address), position, academic degree and field of research interests should be submitted on the accompanying page, which shall also indicate the full name of the author in Latin (according to available documents, such as a passport).

— Bibliographic information should be submitted at the end of the article in the form of a list of literature in alphabetical order (first, sources printed in Cyrillic, then — in Latin, the rest of foreign sources — in Latin transliteration). References to the sources should be given in brackets according to international standards (e.g.: [Burbaki, 1978: Vol. 1, p. 1]), and comments should be in page footnotes with sequential numbering.

— Quotations that have been translated by the author should be enclosed in the original language.

— If the article contains illustrative material (tables, graphs, charts, figures, etc.), each such material should be submitted with the appropriate electronic signature: tables, graphs and diagrams — in formats Excel, drawings — in Corel Draw or Adobe Illustrator formats (imported into Word illustrations are not suitable for future use).

— The Organizing Committee does not return the manuscripts and does not submit reviews. The examination of the editorial board is purely internal.

— The author has no right to submit the materials accepted and approved by the Organizing Committee to other editions.

— Articles signed by authors express their points of views, which may not coincide with the position of the Organizing Committee.

— The Editorial Board has the right to reduce articles and edit literary works.

— Submission of materials to the Organizing Committee requires the consent to be published in printed form and in electronic version in publications with which the Organizing Committee enters into relevant agreements.
